First 60 days				
Complete your access placement surgery.	Your surgeon will place your new access and explain the steps for recovery.	DATE: TIME:		
Have your access checked by your care team.	Your care team will check your new access site at every appointment to look for signs of infection or clotting.	First date of treatment following surgery: DATE: TIME:		
Check your access daily.	Check and care for your access daily to prevent a small irritation from turning into a larger problem.	Caring for your access to last a lifetime		
Schedule and go to your post-surgery follow-up appointment.	Your surgeon will check your access site to make sure it is healing properly.	DATE: TIME:		
First 90 days				
lf you have a fistula, complete your 4-week assessment.	Your care team will make sure your blood vessels have become enlarged and strong. If your fistula does not show signs of maturing, a follow-up procedure may be needed.	DATE: TIME:		
Your first treatment with your new access.	Your care team will check and clean your access before starting treatment. Then, dialysis needles are inserted.	DATE: TIME:		
lf you have a hemodialysis catheter, have it removed.	Your hemodialysis catheter will be removed when you successfully complete treatments with your new access.	DATE: TIME:
